We have 60 spots for students and 12 spots for leaders available on a first come, first paid (deposit) basis. Only those students who have turned in their registration form along with a \$75 deposit will be guaranteed a spot on the trip. The total cost for the trip is \$325. This includes all activities, transportation and food during our stay at the YouthWorks! site. Your child will only need money for four fast food meals and maybe a little extra for any souvenirs they would like to purchase.

Fundraising

A \$50 scholarship from the GO pancake breakfast fundraiser will be awarded to each student. In addition to this, Students will have the opportunity to earn money by selling tickets for and serving at the Valentine's dinner on February 11. Cancellation Policy

You can withdraw from the trip without penalty up until February 9 and you will receive your deposit back. If you withdraw from the trip anytime after February 9, then you will not receive your deposit back and will be responsible for your remaining trip balance. This policy is dictated by Youthworks.

Louisville

Louisville is the largest city in Kentucky with a population of 597,337 and a metropolitan area of 741,096 people that includes Jefferson County. Most native residents pronounce the city's name as "lu-ev-el", which sometimes evolves into "luvel". Nicknamed "Derby City", Louisville gains worldwide attention each year during the annual Kentucky Derby at Churchill Downs. This city is also home to the first cheeseburger ever sold and the Louisville Slugger baseball bats. Despite its progressive economic development, Louisville faces challenges of poverty and homelessness. Our group will have the opportunity to shine the light of Jesus to struggling families through children ministries, serving the elderly, and the homeless of this great city.

Our Goal

The goal of YouthWorks! is to partner with local ministries and programs that seek to address the very basic needs of Louisville's residents. TheMIX students and leaders will work alongside numerous social service organizations to support children's ministries, the elderly and the homeless. Depending on the organization that we partner with, you may be at a specific site the entire week or with different organizations on a rotational basis.
